DDRC END OF YEAR CHAMPIONSHIP

DDRC runs an end of season championship for our competitors.

During the season, all competitors are awarded points depending on their placings in each class at each show. Points are awarded to the horse/pony/rider/handler combination.

The points are awarded as follows:

- 1st Place = 6 points
- 2nd Place = 5 points
- 3rd Place = 4 points
- 4th Place = 3 points
- 5th Place = 2 points
- 6th Place = 1 point

At the end of the season, these points are added together and the competitor with the largest number of points for each class wins a Championship Trophy for that class. The second highest placed competitor wins a Reserve Champion Trophy. These trophies get presented to the winners at our Presentation Evening which takes place in October/November time.

Competitors must compete in classes at a minimum of 2 shows to qualify for the end of year championship.

Please make entries clear using the same name throughout for the horse/pony (and rider)

Congratulations to all of our 2024 Champions and Reserve Champions.

RING ONE – 9.00AM START

CLASSES 1, 2, & 3 ARE STRICTLY FOR BEGINNERS

CLASS 1 – CROSS POLES

Open to any BEGINNER horse/pony/ rider/combination.

Riders can to be lead. Competitors may not compete in Class 5-7.

The class is for beginners only. All jumps will be cross poles. Maximum height 30cm

This class will be split into the following sections: a) Lead Rein b) Ridden

CLASS 2 – NURSERY STAKES

Horse/pony/rider/combination may not compete in classes 5-7.

Riders 12 years and under.

Jumps approx. 40cm (1'3") in the first round. Jump off against the clock.

This class will be split into the following sections: a) Lead Rein b) Ridden

CLASS 3 – BEGINNERS JUMPING sponsored by Rustic Star Healing Equine Reiki

Riders not to be lead. Competitors may not compete in Classes 6 or 7.

Jumps approx. 50cm (1'6") in the first round. Jump off against the clock.

This class will be split into the following sections: a) Juniors b) Adults

CLASS 4 – JUMP ON UP sponsored by Chess Valley Bridleways Association

Riders not to be lead. Competitors may not jump in Classes 1 or 2.

Jumps approx. 60cm (2'0") in the first round. Jump off against the clock.

CLASS 5 WILL NOT START BEFORE 1PM

CLASS 5 – DACORUM CHALLENGE CUP sponsored by Edward Chitty Equestrian

Horse/pony/rider/combination may not compete in classes 1 - 3.

Jumps approx. 70cm (2'3") in the first round

Will be split into the following age groups: a) 12 years and under b) 13 years and over

This class will be judged under either Table A7 or two phase ruling depending on the number of entries.

CLASS 6 –THE PETER PAN STAKES sponsored by Westwick Hall Cross Country Course

Horse/pony/rider/combination may not compete in classes 1 - 3.

Open to any horse/pony/rider/combination not to have been placed 1st in any DDRC 80cm (2 ft 6") class in the prior calendar year. Jumps not to exceed 80cm (2'6") in the first round. Judged table A7.

CLASS 7 – INTERMEDIATE sponsored by Eleanor Curley & William IV

Open to any horse/pony/rider/combination.


Horse/pony/rider/combination not to have competed in Classes 1 to 4.

Jumps not to exceed 90cm (2'9") in the first round. Judged under table A7.

Classes 4, 6 & 7 will be split if numbers exceed 15 into the following sections:

a)Horses
b) Ponies





RING TWO – 9.00AM START **IN HAND SHOWING**

Once the rope on the showing rings has been fastened, there is **STRICTLY** no admittance to the ring by any competitors.

CLASS 8 – TGCA YOUNGSTOCK

Photocopy of Passport to be presented on request. Any horse/pony: 1,2 or 3 year old.

If there are sufficient entries the class will be split into:

- a) 1 and 2 year olds
- b) 3 year olds

This will be at the discretion of the judge. Please give age of animal when entering class.

TGCA - All in hand and ridden classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed finals at TOYS. Full details can be obtained from the TGCA website www.tgca.co.uk

CLASS 9 – TGCA SENIOR (IN HAND) (TGCA Seniors Qualifier 4 and Over)

Horses or ponies of any age. Open to any cob type excluding Welsh Cob.

TGCA - All in hand and ridden classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed finals at TOYS. Full details can be obtained from the TGCA website www.tgca.co.uk

CLASS 10 – TGCA SENIOR (RIDDEN) (TGCA Seniors Qualifier 4 and Over)

Horses/ponies of any age. Open to any cob type excluding Welsh Cob.

TGCA QUEST CHAMPIONSHIP

Quest for a Star Championship - TGC - 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship as per below rule.

ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship.

Membership card and Members qualification card (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS. Note this is open to Ridden and In Hand combinations.

CLASS 11 – TGCA PART BRED YOUNGSTOCK

Photocopy of Passport to be presented on request. Open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs, aged 1,2 or 3 year old, which are of any colour and one parent must be a traditional gypsy cob.

If there are sufficient entries the class will be split into:

- a) 1 and 2 year olds
- b) 3 year olds

This will be at the discretion of the judge. Please give age of animal when entering class.

TGCA Part Bred - All in hand and ridden classes are qualifiers for the Part Bred finals at TOYS. Full details can be obtained from the TGCA website www.tgca.co.uk

CLASS 12 – TGCA PART BRED (IN HAND) (TGCA Part Bred Seniors Qualifier 4 and Over)

Horses or ponies of any age. Open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs, which are of any colour and one parent must be a traditional gypsy cob.


TGCA Part Bred - All in hand and ridden classes are qualifiers for the Part Bred finals at TOYS. Full details can be obtained from the TGCA website www.tgca.co.uk

CLASS 13 – TGCA PART BRED (RIDDEN) (TGCA Part Bred Seniors Qualifier 4 and Over)

Horses/ponies of any age. Open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs, which are of any colour and one parent must be a traditional gypsy cob.

TGCA GO FOR GLORY (GOG) CHAMPIONSHIP - PART BRED TRADITIONAL GYPSY COBS

1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA part bred classes may go forward to the Go for Glory Championship. For 2025 TOYS qualifiers, the handler/rider and exhibits (apart from stallions) do not have to be TGCA members/registered on the date of the show. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Crowning Glory Championships at TOYS.



RING TWO – 11.00AM START **IN HAND SHOWING – Cont.**

Once the rope on the showing rings has been fastened, there is **STRICTLY** no admittance to the ring by any competitors.

CLASS 11 WILL NOT START BEFORE 11.00AM

CLASS 14 – YOUNG STOCK (IN HAND)

Photocopy of Passport to be presented on request. Any horse/pony: 1,2 or 3 year old.

If there are sufficient entries the class will be split into:

- c) 1 and 2 year olds
- d) 3 year olds

This will be at the discretion of the judge. Please give age of animal when entering class.

CLASS 15 – YOUNG HANDLER

Horses or ponies of any age. Will be split into the following:

- a) handler 11 years and under
- b) handler 12 years to 18 years.

Will be judged on the handler's ability to show the horse/pony to the best advantage and neatness of dress of handler. A rosette will be presented to each competitor in this class.

CLASS 16 – COB (IN HAND)

Horses or ponies of any age. Open to any cob type excluding Welsh Cob.

CLASS 17 – COLOURED & ODD COLOURED (IN HAND)

Open to any Skewbald, Piebald, Appaloosa, Creams, Dun, Palomino, Roans, Spots, Paints.

Horse/pony of any age and height. Will be split into the following sections:

- a) Coloured (Skewbald/Piebald)
- b) Odd Coloured (All others)

CLASS 18 – DRIVING TYPE (IN HAND)

Open to horses or ponies of any age. The animal must be suitable for driving.

CHAMPIONSHIP - OPEN TO ALL 1ST AND 2ND PRIZEWINNERS IN CLASSES 14 TO 18.

CLASS 19 WILL NOT START BEFORE 1PM

CLASS 19 – BEST CONDITION (IN HAND)

Horse/pony and rider any age. Will be split into the following:

- a) Horse/pony stabled or part stabled
- b) Horse/pony kept entirely at grass.

CLASS 20 – MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND (IN HAND) – SMALL & LARGE BREEDS *sponsored by Mobs Dogs*

Pure bred ponies of any age. Registered and unregistered. Shetlands, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Kerry Bog ponies, Welsh A, Welsh B, Welsh C, Welsh D, New Forest, Fell, Dales, Highland and Connemara.

CLASS 21 – VETERANS (IN HAND)

Photocopy of Passport to be presented on request.

Open to any horse/pony over 15 years old (born either in or before 2010).

CLASS 22 – RIDING HORSE/PONY (IN HAND)

Open to horses or ponies of Riding Horse Type of any age.

CLASS 23 – RE-TRAINED RACEHORSE (IN HAND)

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, any height. Horses must have been raced in the GB to be eligible to compete.

CLASS 24 – PART BRED (IN HAND)

Open to any horse/pony

CHAMPIONSHIP - OPEN TO ALL 1ST AND 2ND PRIZEWINNERS IN CLASSES 19 TO 24.

Classes 16, 18, 21- 24 will be split, with a minimum number of 15, into the following sections: a) Horses b) Ponies



RING THREE – 9.00AM START

RIDDEN SHOWING

Once the rope on the showing rings has been fastened, there is **STRICTLY** no admittance to the ring by any competitors.

CLASS 25 – BEST TURNED OUT (RIDDEN)

Will be judged on the dress of the rider and the neatness and overall impression of the horse/pony and rider. Lead rein accepted in this class. Any suitable bit can be used in this class.

CLASS 26 – TRUE BEGINNERS (RIDDEN)

A walk and trot showing class for beginners new to showing. Open to horses and ponies, all types and sizes. For beginner combinations just starting showing. You will not be asked to canter in this class. Lead reins accepted. Will be split into the following sections:

- a) Junior Beginners
- b) Senior Beginners

CLASS 27 – HORSE & HUMAN HARMONY (RIDDEN)

A walk and trot showing class. Open to horses/pony/rider combinations. Riders may be any age/ability for able and disabled alike. You will not be asked to canter in this class. Lead reins accepted.

Will be split into the following sections:

- a) Juniors
- b) Seniors

CLASS 28 – LEAD REIN

Open to any pony 4 years old and over and not exceeding 13.2hh. Must be in snaffle bridle.

Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday before January 1st 2024. A rosette will be presented to each competitor in this class. Lead rein must be attached to the noseband..

CLASS 29 – FIRST PONY (RIDDEN) & FIRST PONY M&M (RIDDEN)


Open to any pony 4 years old and over and not exceeding 13.2hh. Must be in snaffle bridle.

Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday before January 1st 2024. A rosette will be presented to each competitor in this class. There will be no cantering as a group in this class..

CHAMPIONSHIP - OPEN TO ALL 1ST AND 2nd PRIZEWINNERS IN CLASSES 25 TO 29.

Class 25 will be split, with a minimum number of 15, into the following sections: a) Horses b) Ponies





RING THREE – 1.00PM START RIDDEN SHOWING - Cont.

Once the rope on the showing rings has been fastened, there is **STRICTLY** no admittance to the ring by any competitors.

CLASS 30 WILL NOT START BEFORE 1PM

CLASS 30 – VETERANS (RIDDEN)

Open to any horse/pony over 15 years old (born either in or before 2010). Lead rein accepted in this class. Please note you may be asked to trot and canter in this class. - ***Photocopy of Passport to be presented on request.***

CLASS 31 – RE-TRAINED RACEHORSE (RIDDEN)

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, any height. Horses must have been raced in the GB to be eligible to compete.

CLASS 32 – RIDDEN HUNTER

Open to horses or ponies of any age of Hunter Type.

CLASS 33 – COLOURED & ODD COLOURED HORSE/PONY (RIDDEN)

Open to any Skewbald, Piebald, Appaloosa, Creams, Dun, Palomino, Roans, Spots, Paints.

Horse/pony of any age and height.

Will be split into the following if more than 15 competitors:

- a) Coloured (Skewbald/Piebald)
- b) Odd Coloured (All others)

CLASS 34 – MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND (RIDDEN) SMALL & LARGE BREEDS [*sponsored by Equine Elegance Essentials*](#)

Pure-bred ponies of any age. Registered and Unregistered. Shetlands, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Kerry Bog Ponies, Welsh A, Welsh B, New Forest, Fell, Dales, Highland, Connemara, Welsh C and D. Lead rein accepted in this class. Please note you may be asked to trot and canter in this class.

Will be split into the following sections more than 15 competitors:

- a) Small Breeds
- b) Large Breeds

CLASS 35 – COB (RIDDEN)

Horses/ponies of any age. Open to any cob type excluding Welsh Cob. May be shown hogged, plaited or unplaited.

CLASS 36 – RIDING HORSE/PONY (RIDDEN)

Open to any horse/pony.

CLASS 37 – BEGINNERS WORKING HUNTER

Each class is split into two phases. Each combination will be required to complete a course of working hunter jumps, followed by an individual show. Height of fences 40cm. The first phase awards 50 marks for jumping (marks deducted for faults) and 20 marks for style, while the second phase gives 10 for manners and way of going and a further 20 for conformation, type and freedom of action.

Judges look for combinations going forward in a balanced rhythmical canter, meeting each fence without a break of stride and showing harmony between pony and rider.

CLASS 38 – NOVICE WORKING HUNTER

Each class is split into two phases. Each combination will be required to complete a course of working hunter jumps, followed by an individual show. Height of fences 60cm. The first phase awards 50 marks for jumping (marks deducted for faults) and 20 marks for style, while the second phase gives 10 for manners and way of going and a further 20 for conformation, type and freedom of action.

Judges look for combinations going forward in a balanced rhythmical canter, meeting each fence without a break of stride and showing harmony between pony and rider.

DDRC CLUB RULES

1. Riding Jackets, jodhpurs and Riding Boots must be worn by all mounted competitors. Un-mounted competitors should be correctly dressed for showing.
- (a) In the case of extreme hot weather, riding jackets may be forfeited but a white long sleeved shirt/blouse must be worn. This is at the judge's discretion.
2. Riding hats with chinstraps must be worn by all persons when mounted on any horse/pony on any part of the showground. Hats must be according to current standards brought in on 1st January 2016. Failure to comply will result in disqualification from the competition if already competed, or if not already competed, you will not be able to compete until you have found a hat which complies to the standard.
3. It is the rider/handler's responsibility to ensure their horse/pony is tacked up correctly. Random spot checks may be carried out.
4. Chinstraps must be fastened at all times. Failure to do so will result in automatic elimination.
5. All animals on the showground must be sound and in good condition.
6. The organizers reserve the right to refuse any entry to any class or entry to the showground without stating a reason
7. No entries will be accepted unless accompanied by the correct fee and all cheques must have the name and address of the signatory on the reverse of the cheque or they will not be accepted.
8. The organizers reserve the right to request a height certificate of any animal and proof of age of riders where there is an entry requirement We also reserve the right to measure any horse/pony Please note that for veterans and young stock a copy of a passport must be available on request.
9. Objections must be made within 30 minutes of the incident and accompanied by a deposit of £20.00 which will be forfeited if the objection is overruled
10. The organizers will not accept any responsibility or liability for loss, damage or illness to any property, person or animal however caused
11. Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times on any part of the showground.
12. No horse or pony under the age of 4 years may be ridden on the showground
13. No galloping or cantering on the showground is allowed except as required by a judge or in the practice areas.
14. Improper use of whips or spurs at any time on the showground will result in elimination. No spurs to be worn by any competitor under the age of 16.
15. A riders age will taken as from January 1st 2025
16. Points will only be awarded from the first show date to the last show date during the year.
17. Competitors must attend a minimum of 2 shows during the year to qualify for the DDRC points system.
18. The ruling of any judge or official is final and any person found arguing will be asked to leave the showground
19. Any person found mistreating any animal or using bad language will be asked to leave the showground
20. A combination can enter no more than 4 classes of which no more than 3 can be a SJ/WH
21. The organizers reserve the right to either alter or cancel any class and to amalgamate any class where there are insufficient entries
22. Points are accumulated on rider/horse or pony and handler/horse or pony. Horse/pony names must remain the same throughout the season (if the horse is the same horse).
23. Once the rope on the showing rings has been fastened, there is STRICTLY no admittance to the ring by any competitors.
24. A horse or pony may now jump hors concours immediately after its competitive round and not wait until the end of the class. The horse/pony who has jumped hors concours will remain hors concours in that ring for the rest of the day.
25. We will not tolerate any abuse on our showground. Anyone using abusive behaviour to another person will be asked to leave the showground.
26. Judges decisions and rulings in any class are final.



SUNSHINE TOUR RULES

This show is a qualifier for The Sunshine Tour Championship held at The All England Jumping Course, Hickstead from 11th – 14th September 2025. The Championships are for unaffiliated and amateur competitors of in Dressage from Intro to Elementary, Showjumping from Lead Rein to 1.0m, Showing for lead rein, in hand, ridden, working hunter, veterans, plus many more.

Qualification: Dressage & Show Jumping 1st – 3rd place; Showing & Eventers Challenge 1st – 4th place. Qualification does not pass down the line.

Registration of qualification must be completed within 1 month of competition (sooner for late July shows). Restrictions apply to both horse and competitor's previous winnings and amateur status, please check the website for Terms & Conditions.

Equine Sports UK Grassroots Championships are held solely for grass-roots competitors. We respectfully remind all competitors to enter in the spirit of grassroots championships.

To avoid confusion our definition of Grassroots is as follows:

Definition of a grassroots rider - a person who engages in the most basic level of horse-riding (as opposed to an amateur - a person who engages in a pursuit, especially a sport, on an unpaid basis)

The following restrictions apply and are excluded from the Championships:

Professional Riders, (those who make a *full-time* living out of buying, selling, producing, breaking, schooling, teaching, grooming, training or competing).

Horses/Ponies/Riders combination not to have qualified or competed in any classes at Olympia, RIHS or Horse of the Year Show including Search for a Star in the past five years.

Rider not to have ridden at Olympia, RIHS, Horse of the Year Show including Search for a Star in the past five years.

Classes may be divided according to entries

2. EQUIFEST OPEN RIDDEN MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND (DDRC Class 34)

Open to Mountain & Moorland ponies registered with their respective Pure Bred Societies of Connemara, Dales, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Shetland, Welsh A, B, C and D. Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Rider any age.

Classes may be divided according to entries

7. EQUIFEST OPEN SHOW PONY LEAD REIN (DDRC Class 28)

Leading Rein Pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 8th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle. Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

8. EQUIFEST OPEN SHOW PONY FIRST RIDDEN (DDRC Class 29)

First Ridden Pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 10th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle.

13. EQUIFEST OPEN SMALL HUNTERS (DDRC Class 32)

Open Small Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age.

14. EQUIFEST OPEN RIDDEN HUNTERS (DDRC Class 32)

Open Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 158cms. Riders any age.

19. EQUIFEST OPEN RIDING HORSES (DDRC Class 36)

Open Riding Horse, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, any height. Riders any age.

Classes may be divided as follows:

- Small Riding Horses - mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age.
- Large Riding Horses - mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 158cms. Riders any age.

20. EQUIFEST OPEN RIDDEN COBS (DDRC Class 35)

Open Ridden Cob, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms. To be shown hogged and trimmed. Riders any age.

Classes may be divided as follows:

- Open Lightweight Ridden Cob, mare or gelding, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms. To be shown hogged and trimmed. Riders any age.
- Open Heavyweight Ridden Cob, mare or gelding, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms. To be shown hogged and trimmed. Riders any age.

22. EQUIFEST OPEN RE-TRAINED RACE HORSE (DDRC Class 31)

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, any height. Horses must have been raced in the GB to be eligible to compete.

24. OPEN RIDDEN VETERAN HORSE / PONY (DDRC Class 30)

Stallion, mare or gelding, 15 years old and over. Any type or breed. Rider any age.
Classes may be divided according to entries.

25. EQUIFEST IN HAND PIEBALD / SKEWBALD (DDRC Class 17)

Open in Hand Piebald / Skewbald stallion, mare, colt, filly or gelding, any age. The first three places will also qualify for the BSPA Championships subject to their show rules & conditions
Classes may be divided according to entries.

26. EQUIFEST RIDDEN PIEBALD / SKEWBALD (DDRC Class 33)

Open ridden Piebald / Skewbald stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over. Riders any age. The first three places will also qualify for the BSPA Championship subject to their show rules & conditions.
Classes may be divided according to entries.

27. EQUIFEST OPEN IN HAND RIDING PONIES (DDRC Class 22)

In hand Riding Ponies, stallion, mare, colt, filly or gelding. Any age, not to exceed 153cms at maturity.
